I hold the following qualifications:

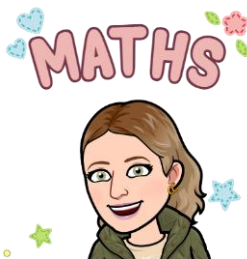
- National SENCO Award
